



## Dubai Roadster 2008

**Bangkok – Angkor Wat – Pattaya**  
(approx. 1,000 km)



**24<sup>th</sup> October – 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2008**

**24<sup>th</sup> October 2008**

**Dubai – meeting at the Dubai Airport at 8.00 pm.**

**Dubai – Bangkok**

Arrive Bangkok in the morning of 25<sup>th</sup> October 2008

**25<sup>th</sup> October 2008**

**Day 1, Bangkok – Khao Yai --- 80km ride**

Pick up from airport and transfer to Khao Yai – time to assemble bikes and warm up ride through Khao Yai National Park, includes a 35 km climb.



**Khao Yai is Thailand's oldest National Park**, September 1962. In 1982 it was enlisted as an ASEAN heritage site due to its variety of flora and fauna, and is now world - famous. Khao Yai has also been nominated as a World Heritage Site. It is Thailand's third largest Nation Park, covering an area of 2,165.55 sq.km. and its highest peak, Khao Rom, reaches an elevation of 1,351 m. above sea level. Khao Yai is part of the Dongrak Range, which forms a mountainous wall fencing the northeast plateau from the central plain of Thailand. Park headquarters are situated roughly 200 km northeast of Bangkok.

Overnight – Grand View Thani Resort with beautiful view over Khao Yai and surrounding country side.

**26<sup>th</sup> October 2008**

**Day 2, Khao Yai to Sa Kaew --- 185km ride**

**Ride to Gang Hin Poeng and then onto Sa Kaew**

**Sakeaw** is a new province in the East of Thailand, bordering Cambodia. As a result, it has inherited the Khmer culture. It is also a major border check-point and a huge market place. Aside from historical sites, its natural beauty is second to none as evidenced by its slogan "an eastern border province with glorious forests and waterfalls".

**27<sup>th</sup> October 2008**

**Day 3, Sa Kaew to Angkor Wat --- 110km ride**

**Ride to border and then transfer to Siem Reap, Cambodia**

**28<sup>th</sup> October 2008**

**Day 4, Visit Angkor Wat by mountain bike --- 30km ride**

**The Seven Wonders of the World, Angkor Wat** ---- the temples at Angkor are spread out over some 40 miles around the village of Siem Reap, about 192 miles from the Cambodian capital, Phnom Penh. They were built between the eighth and 13th centuries and range from single towers made of bricks to vast stone temple complexes. There are two main sites where the Khmer temples are located. The first is at Roluos which is about 10 miles south east of today's village of Siem Reap, where only a few of the earlier temples were built. This was the first Khmer capital in the Angkor area. In the late ninth century, Yasovarman I moved the capital to the immediate vicinity of Siem Reap

**29<sup>th</sup> October 2008**

**Day 5, Siem Reap to Soi Dao --- 100km ride, transfer back to border and ride to Soi Dao**

Soi Dao is the district in a famous for its abundance of tropical fruits and as a centre of gems, the eastern province of Chanthaburi in Thailand is also blessed with rich, verdant forests with scenic waterfalls. The Chanthaburi River flows through the town which has been the home of ancient communities. Quiet fishing villages and peaceful beaches are not far from town.

**30<sup>th</sup> October 2008**

**Day 6, Soi Dao to Chao Lao Beach --- 110km ride**



**Chao Lao Beach** in Chanthaburi the beach is popular among locals who come here on weekend. It boasts brown sandy beach and shallow water suitable for swimming. This 12-kilometre stretch of white sandy beach is a perfect place to enjoy the scenery while swimming. The beach trails along the way to meet Ban Kon Ao, where a small fishing community can be found

Overnight – Seashell Village

**31<sup>st</sup> October 2008**

**Day 7, Chao Lao Beach - Mae Rum Pheung Beach to Pattaya --- 200km ride**

Pattaya is nestled along a picturesque bay on the East Coast of the Gulf of Thailand. Unlike other beach resorts, where natural surroundings are used as magnets to attract tourists, Pattaya makes an all-out attempt to provide the best of everything. Here, everything means everything a tourist can imagine while on holiday: recreation, entertainment, sports, sightseeing and fun. To put it simply, Pattaya is a paradise for everyone, as it has a variety of attractions suitable for all types of visitors. This is the place where you can fill your day, from dusk to dawn, with endless activities, or you may choose to do nothing at all and relax.
